

Arts & Scraps programming offers a variety of fun and engaging educational programs that foster social and emotional growth, creativity, and fine motor skills through hands-on learning. Our curriculum-based lessons are aligned with State and National standards and are designed to be adaptable to individual needs! We provide students with customized kits that allow them to create right at their desks. Children are encouraged to learn, create, and explore their curiosity and imagination through our store and the ScrapMobile bus. Additionally, we offer onsite programming in schools, after-school programs, and community centers. Approximately 66% of our programs are based in the city of Detroit, while 34% occur outside the city. We are committed to providing high-quality educational programming that encourages creativity and imagination for children in the community.




### **A Financial Snapshot**

### Brilliant Detroit creating kid success neighborhoods Arts & Scraps Education Reimagined

### **BRILLIANT DETROIT PARTNERSHIP**

During the summer and fall, we expanded our partnership with Brilliant Detroit, an organization dedicated to preparing students for early childhood development by using underutilized housing stock to create early child and family centers in neighborhoods.

Our instructors provided STEM Education Programming at Brilliant Detroit Houses for neighborhood students in grades K-5. The workshops were held outside and were designed to be socially distanced.

Each workshop focused on a specific STEM concept and included a themed creative activity for students to work on. Additionally, during the fourth and eighth weeks of the program, students had the opportunity to shop our ScrapMobile for materials. We were honored to serve the Central, Fitzgerald, Morningside, Brightmoor, and Southwest houses through this partnership.

"Since the beginning, she has been consistent and compassionate like our Brightmoor children were her own. She has brought fun and thought-provoking activities twice a week for the past 6 months and unlike me, she remembered names very fast. We had one child who wanted to be call Huggy Wuggy. So each visit she would say 'Hey Huggy Wuggy!!' Then when he wanted to change his name to something else, she would play right along. Ms. Rachel has hugged the sad kids and laughed and played with the overenergetic ones. She has taught our kids some really cool things about art & science but more importantly to us, she made EVERYONE feel creative and important.

My son Tyrese just loves coming to the Brilliant house for Arts & Scraps class. He really looks forward to it after school. He is getting much more creative with things around our house and he pays a lot of attention to what we can recycle. Tyrese even asks me which trash can to throw things away in. The blue one or the black one. I am so happy I enrolled him in this program and he is too.

"I just wanted to say how thankful we are at Brilliant Detroit Brightmoor to have the Arts & Scraps Explorers Program over the past year. It has really brought our families closer to art and science. The children of Brightmoor have learn so much about recycling materials and being creative. Rachel and Katie have been the most amazing instructors. Their patience and flexibility working with our children has been nothing less than stellar. They teach with so much passion and knowledge about science that the kids don't even realize it's a class, it's more like play time. I have had the pleasure of hosting the Explorers Program at our Brightmoor site for almost a year now and it is a staple on our calendar. Our families look forward to it and the consistency it provides to the growth and development of their children. The ScrapMobile and store budget allowance has been VERY instrumental in allowing us the opportunity for children to create gifts for family during the holidays and even teachers during teacher appreciation week.

Arts and Scraps has not only taught our children about the benefits of recycling and being creative but the parents too. When our children leave the site with their art projects, parents are wowed with what their children created with just a few pieces of scrap materials. I want to send a huge THANK YOU to you and your amazing staff for bring art and science to the Brightmoor community. We look forward to a long lasting relationship with you.

The livestream was a way for people to participate in Giving Tuesday and learn more about some nonprofits that service SE Michigan. The nonprofits involved serve in many ways. Arts & Scraps count art, STEM, and education as their focus. The Chip Bag Project, an organization that takes recycled and misprinted chip bags and converts them into sleeping bags for the displaced and misplaced, created their first warming station with recycled materials at Arts & Scraps. There were videos featuring Brilliant Detroit to showcase their work with Detroit's youth. Spread Art Detroit, Women of Banglatown, the Hendricks Foundation, and Mint Artists Guild were also featured in the stream. Each organization involved accepted donations.
